From Unimaginable Evil to Indescribable Glory

A message from Fr. Gabriel

ater this month, whether we will be celebrating together in the Church or separately in our own homes, the entire world will be a witness to an **unimaginable evil**, followed by an **indescribable tri- umph of Glory!** It is during the most sacred time of the year, Holy



Week, where we all will journey with our Lord towards Golgotha and witness The Creator of all endure betrayal, torture, and crucifixion out of His love for mankind. Then, after three days in the tomb, the darkness turns to light, as we celebrate the Glory of the Resurrection on Great and Holy Pascha!

When we take a step back and look at Holy Week, we see this reoccurring theme that has manifested itself in our own day and age. **Glory, no matter how much evil is brought into its midst...always Triumphs**. We don't need to look far to see proof of this reality!

Three years ago on Palm Sunday, as joy was reigning through a Coptic Church in Egypt, we watched in horror as a suicide bomber brought death and unbelievable sorrow which shook the Christian World. The images and the stories were enough to drag someone down to their lowest low. Yet despite the evil...despite all of the threats against the lives of the Christians who were living there...Holy Week and Pascha that year had **record attendance** in Egypt. On Pascha Night, they shouted with loud shouts of joy, that despite the darkness was brought against them: **Glory Triumphs and Christ is Risen!**

Last year, during Holy Week for our brothers and sisters in the West, the world witnessed the tragedy of one of the oldest Catholic Churches in the world smoldering in the midst of Paris. Notre Dame, that beautiful Cathedral that holds so much history and is home to incredible relics (including the crown of thorns that Christ wore on His way to Golgotha), was seen burning to the ground. Anyone who followed this tragedy on the news or on the internet saw the evil come out of the woodwork. Numerous comments from our brothers and sisters who lead lives shrouded in the midst of darkness, jeering at the weeping Parisians, and asking the same question that the Jews asked when they saw Christ on the Cross: "Where is Your God now?"

It was only a short time after that we began to see the answer to that very question, as footage began to come out of the thousands of faithful throughout the entire city of Paris, with the cathedral burning to the ground, singing with incredible beautify "Ave Maria", and asking our Mother to protect not just the building of the Cathedral, but to also look after the Living Body of the Church.

Today, we face a new kind of evil, one that has manifested itself in the form of a virus that has spread throughout the world. Every one of us has faced some sort of internal persecution that has come from either taking care of the sick, dealing with the "new normal" of social distancing, and not being able to regularly receive the lifegiving sacraments. Unlike the tragedies that have befallen Christians during the last three years of Holy Weeks, we do not yet know all of the triumphs and glories that will come from this tremendous trial. But, we remember how our Lord, while He was still walking amidst the world, said these prophetic words which still reign true today: "In the world, you will have tribulation...but be of good cheer...! am overcome the world".

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, once again, we are going to see Glory Triumph in the midst of evil later on this month. On Palm Sunday, the joys of Jerusalem will reign! Sunday night, the lights go out, and we all begin our journey with Christ as He is led to Golgotha. After His crucifixion, the world will shake their heads, cast lots for His possessions, and ask that question that we hear so often from the unbelievers in the midst of this pandemic: "Where is your God now? If He was all powerful…let Him come down from the Cross!" But, despite all of the wickedness, despite the hate, despite the internal persecution, we take heart and are filled with the sure hope of the joy and triumph that is to come.

Keep Calm my dear ones...Pascha is coming!






Our Thoughts Determine Our Lives: The Life and Teachings of Elder Thaddeus of Vitovnica

Elder Thaddeus of Vitovnica was one of the most renowned spiritual guides of Serbia in the

twentieth century. As a novice he lived in obedience to Elder Ambrose of Miljkovo Monastery, a disciple of the Optina Elders. From him Fr. Thaddeus learned the Prayer of the Heart and the selfless love that came to characterize his whole ministry to the suffering Serbian people. Born in 1914, Elder Thaddeus lived through all the suffering endured by Serbia in the twentieth century. Over the course of two World Wars, during the Communist takeover, and through the NATO bombings of 1999, he cosuffered with his people. He taught, counseled, and prayed for all who came to him in pain and sorrow. His words of love and hope provided spiritual balm for people from all classes of society. In 2002 Elder Thaddeus reposed, leaving behind a large collection of his teachings, preserved by his faithful spiritual children. His life,


teachings, and spiritual conversations are here presented for the first time in



The Great and Holy Myrrh-bearer **Mary Magdalene**, equal to the apostles, and the patroness and protectress of our parish was a disciple of Jesus.

She was Mary for Magdala, a town in Galilee. She was present at the crucifixion and the burial of Christ. She was one of the first to see Him risen from the Dead. (Matthew 27:55-61, Mark 16:1-10)



In her icon, St. Mary Magdalene is depicted holding a red egg telling the story of her attending the Emperor's banquet. She is holding a vessel, this tells the story of her as one of the Myrrhbearing women. Lastly it shows her holding a cross which tells of her martyr death.




