#### 5 Steps to Gain Invincibility from the World

From the Desk of Fr. Gabriel

The coming of the New Year in the Liturgical Calendar (September 1st) typically brings about articles written by priests about various "New Year's Resolutions" that we can implement in our spiritual lives in order to draw near to Christ. As we have been reading through Saint Paul's letter to the Corinthians these past few weeks in Church, I thought it would be appropriate to focus on his parting words of wisdom to the Corinthians, which were made not only for the Christians at that time, but for all of us centuries later!

We have been dealing with a lot these past few years, ranging from a worldwide pandemic, to political infighting, to other bad pieces of news that have been cropping upon a weekly basis. I would argue, that if we kept St. Paul's 5 directives in our hearts, in our minds, and at the for-front of **EVERYTHING** that we do this year, we would become (and I love this word because it carries a powerful connotation with it) **INVINCIBLE** to the World. No Life Stress would bring us down. No disease would cause us panic. No bad news would affect us. No persecution would destroy our faith. No natural or manmade disaster could shake us. No Government could topple us. Literally NOTHING could destroy us, if we keep the following resolutions for the upcoming new year.

#### 1.) "Be Watchful."

Do we want to become invincible? The first step is to be watchful of what kinds of poison we let seep into our souls, our hearts, and our minds. There is a beautiful quote from St. Hesychius of Jerusalem who says: "Just as it is impossible to live this life without eating or drinking, so it is impossible for the soul to achieve anything spiritual and in accordance with God's will, without guarding the intellect and purity of heart..."

St. Paul, St. Hesychius, and so many others who have succeeded in conquering the world by becoming invincible to it, have all said the same thing. We have to be on guard and watchful of the poisons that we allow to seep into our heart. Bad news, political infighting, inappropriate television shows and movies, situations that lead to arguments, whatever it is that leads the passions to become enflamed within us...now is the time to walk away.

#### 2.)"Stand Firm in the Faith."

We put our faith and trust in a lot of things these days. This past week, I made a deposit at my bank, putting my trust in them that the money would still be there when I need it. None of us probably woke up today worried that our cell phones wouldn't work, because we put our faith in the fact that the towers will all be working. We put our faith in the electric companies this morning, knowing that they will provide electricity so we can take a hot shower and get ready to start the day.

What happens when these things that we put our unyielding faith in fail? When we lose power, we panic. When we lose or drop calls, we feel uneasy. When there is a run on the bank, the world is thrown into chaos. Why is it that we put our unyielding trust and faith in man made things that fail, and can't put that same kind of faith in Christ?

#### 5 Steps to Gain Invincibility from the World Cont.

True Faith in God is something that can **never** fail us. There are those who don't put their faith in things they cannot see, and to those people, the Church says: "Open Your Eyes dear ones!".

Look at the results of His works in our lives! Even this very moment, you are reading an article written by a simple village priest about the spiritual life. Do you realize how many millions or tiny miracles that are happening for you to be able to do that?

God has a better track record than the electric companies. He is more reliable than our cell phone service. He is far and away beyond the scientific community, who has been and always will be unable to comprehend His magnificence and His hands in the world. No matter what happens in life, we have to stand firm in our Faith, and make it as natural as trusting that the lights will go on in our homes.

#### 3 & 4.) Be Courageous and Be Strong.

I put these two together, because there are times when it takes courage to have faith, especially living in a society where faith in God has been replaced by so many other, less reliable things. We have to have the **courage** to put our faith and our lives completely into the hands of God, and it takes **God Given strength** to navigate a difficult situation and say "Thy Will be Done" (especially living in a country that often pushes "My Will Be Done.")

#### 5.) "Let All You Do Be Done in Love".

EVERYTHING that we do needs to be done in Love for God FIRST and then love for one another second. We show love for God, by making commitments to ourselves to not put him second in our lives as we are so often tempted to do. A wonderful example of this is the 12 major feast days of the Church, coupled with the Major Feast Day, the Mini Pascha that occurs every Sunday morning. Given that some of those feasts fall on a Sunday, that is around 60 opportunities this coming year to put Him FIRST...to put the Mystical Supper with God FIRST...

to schedule our vacations and our fun activities around our unyielding Love for **HIM** (That also, by the way, takes courage and strength)!

Second, we show **love for one another** in everything we do. If we get angry when we see things on Facebook or upset when we hear about politics in the news, that is probably not a good sign that we can (in that moment) come up with a response planted in love. If we can't have conversations that are rooted in love for the person we are talking to, and I mean truly rooted not just with words, but from our hearts, then it is best not to poison our souls, or theirs, with our words.

Watchfulness, firmness in faith, courage, strength, and love. These are the five directives from St. Paul, that if we dedicate our entire lives to implementing them, we would truly be INVINCIBLE to the cunning attacks of the deceiver. As we begin this New Liturgical Year, may our Lord Grant them to us, and to all those whom we Love!




#### READING

THE ORTHODOX VENERATION
OF THE MOTHER OF GOD

#### BY ST JOHN MAXOMOVICH

A right understanding of Mary, the Mother of God is essential for a right understanding of Jesus Christ, the incarnate Son of God. When her image is distorted, the image of her Son also becomes distorted.

This concise little book is a classic exposition of how the Orthodox Christian Church has venerated the Mother of God throughout the ages, and on the chief errors that have sought to change or undermine this veneration: both ancient heresies and the later deviations of Western Christendom. It clearly tells why the Virgin Mary should truly be called the Mother of God and should be honored by all generations, and why at the same time She cannot be said to have been unable to sin, or considered a Co-Redemptress along with Jesus Christ, the only Savior of the world.



#### MONTHLY FORECAST

#### **New Liturgy Start Time:**

Starting for the Divine Liturgy on July 1 st, we will be beginning adding the 6 th hours to our prayers before Liturgy. Sunday Services will therefore begin at 9:40 AM

#### **Public Pre-Communion Prayers:**

After Great Vespers, while Father is offering confessions, we will begin reading the Pre- Communion prayers so that everyone in attendance can begin their focus on what is to come for the Divine Liturgy. Please consider staying after Great Vespers to hear these incredible prayers, which describe the moments in which we physically receive Christ!

#### **Dormition Fast:**

At the beginning of August from the 1st through the 14th, the Church reminds us to fast from meat and dairy to the best of our ability, to remember the purity and holiness of the Theotokos. If you have more questions on how to fast during these periods, please see Fr. Gabriel!

#### **Feast of Holy Transfiguration:**

The first of the two Great Feasts in August is that of Holy Transfiguration! The feast will be celebrated with Great Vespers and Lijtia on Friday, August 5 th at 6:00 PM. Pan-Orthodox Divine Liturgy will be held at St. George on Saturday, August 6th beginning at 10:00 AM

#### **Blessing of the Harvest:**

It is customary to bless grapes and the harvest for the feast of Transfiguration in the Orthodox Church. All families are encouraged to bring a basket of grapes, fruits, or something from their garden to be blessed on Sunday, August 7 th, following the Divine Liturgy!

#### **Divine Liturgy for St. Herman:**

We will hold a Divine Liturgy in honor of St. Herman of Alaska, who's holy relics we have in the Church, on Tuesday, August 9 th, at 10:00 AM. This will take the place of our regular Wednesday Divine Liturgy!

#### Reader's Workshop:

As we are adding the 6 th hour, as well as pre-communion prayers to our regular schedule, this is a great time to have all of our readers gather together for a special Reader's Workshop on August 13 th at 3:00 PM. All current or prospective readers are expected to attend!!

#### **Dormition Pilgrimage to the Holy Monastery:**

Due to our current Church construction, we are encouraging all of our visitors to go to the Holy Dormition Monastery in Rives Junction, MI for their Monastery Feast Day! Vigil with Lamentation will take place on Sunday, August 14 th at 6:00 PM. Outdoor Divine Liturgy will be held on Monday, August 15 th, at 10:00 AM in the pavilion.

#### **Cedar Point Trip:**

Our annual parish trip to Cedar Point is scheduled for Wednesday, August 17 th! Tickets can be purchased in advance at www.cedarpoint.com/daily-tickets, and they start at \$49 for Michigan Residents! #### PASTORAL REFLECTIONS ON THE FOUR PILLARS OF CHURCH GROWTH

#### What is Happening in the Pillar of Worship?

As is the case sometimes in the summer, attendance has dipped down a little bit for the Church services. My prayer is that as the summer wraps up and we get to August (which has within it several major feast days) that attendance will get back up to its usual levels! Despite the vacations, we still had wonderful attendance for our St. Mary Magdalene Parish Feast Day Celebrations! Thanks to all who sang the akathist, who attended the services, and to all who helped organize our picnic afterwards!

As some of you know, our parish was blessed with the addition of a few relics that I received from the Orthodox Church in America's Museum Curator, including a piece of the vestment of St. Seraphim of Sarov, relics of St. Silouan of Mt. Athos, and a small relic of St. Innocent of Irkurtsk! Reliquaries will be ordered soon and special Akathist Services will be scheduled to celebrate the presence of these Saints in our community!

#### What is Happening in the Pillar of Community?


While we will be saying goodbye to Rdr, Paisios, Anna, John, and Theodore Hamann, we have also had the blessing of saying hello to many new inquirers and catechumens! In terms of upcoming community events, we have the Cedar Point Trip and Parish Camping Trip that are scheduled for this coming month!

#### What is Happening in the Pillar of Education?

We will be hosting a one day "Vacation Church School" day camp to coincide with the Parish Camping Trip. Great Vespers will be served at the campground, and there will be activities for our children to grow and learn more about their faith. The event is scheduled for Saturday, August 27th, and all of our Church School Aged Children from 4-11 are asked to attend, unless they have a conflict worthy of a blessing!

#### What is Happening in the Pillar of Stewardship?

The painting of the exterior of the education center is continuing thanks to the help of one of our catechumens. We also have had several people volunteering to do some landscaping projects around the Church, such as the removal of the bamboo towards the foundation of the back of our building. In regards to financial stewardship, the Parish Council is offering an update on the expansion funding in a separate letter that will be included in this bulletin.

Glory Be To Jesus Christ! Glory Forever!

The church building project is underway with the foundation for the addition coming along nicely. Soon, we will be able to see the expanded footprint for our beautiful church in the woods!

The Parish Council is requesting your continued support and is providing a status update on construction costs and funds. Here is our current situation:

- +Currently we have \$503k in cash that should last us through the end of September at the current progress of construction. We have spent \$158k so far towards the main building.
- +We have been approved for a \$350k loan through the Orthodox Church Capital Improvement Fund. This puts our total buying power at \$1,011,000.
- +The estimated cost for the entire project is about \$1,100,000. Estimated costs almost always change in projects like this. Once framing has begun this fall, many planning contingencies will be resolved, and it will be easier to estimate remaining costs with more precision. We will update the estimated cost in October.

Based on the newest figures, the Parish Council is asking you to consider making additional contributions to the Church Building Fund so that we can meet the following goals. If we can raise an additional \$90,000, we will be in a better position to proceed without making changes to plans or schedule. If we raise more than this, we could potentially reduce the size of the loan, which would reduce the loan payment, expected to be about \$2,260 per month.

We will re-evaluate this plan in October when we have more precise information. At that point we can adjust as needed (e.g., delay some items, cut some finishes, or seek other funding sources). Any contributions to the Building Fund made before October will greatly assist our long term financial health and will help our construction planning as we expand our beautiful church in the woods!





# "METANOIA"

Learning to change one's heart for God







In a Christian World now littered with various denominations, each teaching a different version of the same Gospel, have you ever wondered or thought what about what the earliest Christians taught? ### FELLOWSHIP AGAPE MEALS

Agape (Greek agapē): in the New Testament, the fatherly love of God for humans, as well as the human reciprocal love for God. In Scripture, the transcendent agape love is the highest form of love and is contrasted with eros, or erotic love, and philia, or brotherly love.

#### **Sobornost: Divine-Human Oneness**

Sobornost means spiritual harmony based on freedom and unity in love. It is a necessary component in our membership with the Body of Christ, for if we are not bound together in love, our freedom becomes our enemy, separating us from others and ultimately from Christ Himself. This concept was so important to early Christians that it was the basis for the agape meal, when Christians shared their food with one another after the celebration of the eucharistic banquet.

That the pre-communion fast would be broken after the Divine Liturgy with a communal meal (the love feast) clearly demonstrates the importance of community within the life of the Church. Sobornost is the divine human oneness we experience as members of the on Body, the Church, and is the moment when we who are many become one. It is the image of the unity of the Holy Trinity, finding its expression among the believers.

Sobornost is not the same as fraternity, a submission to a brotherhood for benefit of the individual. Rather, it is akin to *kenosis* (the relinquishment of divine attributes by Jesus Christ in becoming human) Sobornost is when the individual gives up self-benefit for the community or ecclesia.

We cannot truly be one in Christ if we do not seek out oneness with our fellow Christians. Nor can we be one with Christ if we routinely reject sobornost for heights of spirituality that make us so conscious of self that they separate us from our neighbor.




