

Simeon's Prophecy

From the Desk of Fr. Gabriel We have spent these last 40 days, celebrating the events of the Winter Pascha, remembering and watching in awe as the Creator of the Universe, humbled Himself to become a small and helpless child, born in a cave, becoming man so that we could become gods!

On February 2nd, at the completion of these 40 days, we remember how the most-pure Virgin brought the Christ Child to the temple for the first time, which was the custom of the law. This offering of a child to the temple was a very serious matter in the Old Testament and in the life of Israel. If we remember back from the book of Exodus, after God had brought the 10 plagues upon Egypt, He said that from that day forward there would be a firstborn rite for His people. Every first-born child of every family, from the day of their birth, belonged to God.

As was the Jewish Custom to "get the child back", the family had to bring the newborn into the temple and offer a sacrifice of either a lamb (for those that could afford it) or two turtle doves. This was the offering to God for the return of Jesus to the family.

40 days after Christ's birth, the Theotokos brought Jesus to the temple. He was welcomed by the High Priest Zachariah, who we know from history was the Father of St. John the Baptist. Zachariah took the Child, and then did something that was unthinkable at the time! He invited Mary to go to the place in the temple that was set apart for the virgins!

This of course infuriated the Pharisees, who were the "temple lawyers" of the day! "How can Zacharias allow this woman, who clearly just had a son, and is here with her betrothed, sit in *the place of the Virgins!"* They were no doubt furious as to what they were seeing!

As Mary took her place in the temple, a righteous elder named Simeon, who we are told was a very "devout and just man, one who obeyed all of the commandments", comes and wants to hold the Christ child in his arms. He had been told by the Holy Spirit decades before, that he would not pass from this life until he had seen with his own eyes the Savior of the world. Taking the child in his arms, Simeon offered us that beautiful prayer that we still sing at least once a week here at the Church at Great Vespers:

"Lord, now let Your Servant depart in peace...according to Your Word. For my eyes have seen Your Salvation, which you have prepared before all peoples. A light to enlighten the Gentiles, and the Glory of your People Israel."

Simeon's Prophecy Continued

Holy Tradition tells us that the Pharisees were furious about what they were seeing: *"How long are we going to let this charade continue and allow this man to speak blasphemies about this young child!"* They quickly stormed off to tell Herod the horrible things that they had seen, but by the time Herod had summoned his men to investigate, the family had already left the temple.

Before giving Jesus back to Mary, perhaps after seeing the Pharisees become enraged and storm out of the Temple, Simeon said something else that is striking to hear, **especially** in our day and age: "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rising of many in Israel..." To put it a different way, those who approach this child with humble hearts, obedience, and clarity of vision will be raised up in the Glory of Christ. However, those who are like the Pharisees, those who are full of pride and resist the truth, will eventually fall.

These Pre-Lenten Sundays in February are **vital** for all Christians who desire to be on the right side of that prophecy from Simeon! We are all about to embark on a 40 day journey of self-emptying, of purification, and of sacrifice known as Great Lent. Anyone who has experienced Lent to it's fullness knows that it is an absolutely wonderful marathon for the spiritual life! But like any marathon, it requires training and preparation from us as Christians, and this is what this month is all about.

If we do not prepare, if we don't stretch ourselves for the beginning of the marathon, what happens when the gate finally opens? We cramp up and fall flat on our faces! Use this time as a period of examination, slowly changing those habits that have been built up throughout the year. Ask yourself:

Do we spend more time on our phones or on the internet, than we do in prayer? Do we get angry with the politics of the day?

Are we able to control our stomachs by saying "no" to more food than what is needed? Have we caught ourselves from swearing or have we stayed away from situations that would cause us to?

Have we kept the openings of our soul: Our eyes, our ears, our mouth away from situations or negative entertainment that could affect us?

When we pick up our bibles, do we have to blow on them to get the dust off? Have we picked up and read at least one chapter of the New Testament outside of Church this year?

Have we invoked our Lord's name in prayer at least once a day? Have we had at least one prostration before our Lord in a prayer at home? (You will do them all the time coming up shortly...get those abs ready!)

Have we judged anyone more harshly than we do ourselves? Have we shown love to everyone who comes into our path?

If there are priorities that are completely out of alignment, we need to be using this time of preparation to begin correcting them. When the dust finally settles after blowing off our bibles and our prayer rules, if we have all done our spiritual cleanse faithfully, we will find ourselves on the right end of Simeon's prophecy, and be able to rise up with our Lord on that glorious day of His Resurrection!

BUILDING UPDATE



Memorial Saturday:



FELLOWSHIP AGAPE MEALS

Agape (Greek agapē): in the New Testament, the fatherly love of God for humans, as well as the human reciprocal love for God. In Scripture, the transcendent agape love is the highest form of love and is contrasted with eros, or erotic love, and philia, or brotherly love.

Sobornost: Divine-Human Oneness

Sobornost means spiritual harmony based on freedom and unity in love. It is a necessary component in our membership with the Body of Christ, for if we are not bound together in love, our freedom becomes our enemy, separating us from others and ultimately from Christ Himself. This concept was so important to early Christians that it was the basis for the agape meal, when Christians shared their food with one another after the celebration of the eucharistic banquet.

That the pre-communion fast would be broken after the Divine Liturgy with a communal meal (the love feast) clearly demonstrates the importance of community within the life of the Church. Sobornost is the divine human oneness we experience as members of the on Body, the Church, and is the moment when we who are many become one. It is the image of the unity of the Holy Trinity, finding its expression among the believers.

Sobornost is not the same as fraternity, a submission to a brotherhood for benefit of the individual. Rather, it is akin to *kenosis* (the relinquishment of divine attributes by Jesus Christ in becoming human) Sobornost is when the individual gives up self-benefit for the community or ecclesia.

We cannot truly be one in Christ if we do not seek out oneness with our fellow Christians. Nor can we be one with Christ if we routinely reject sobornost for heights of spirituality that make us so conscious of self that they separate us from our neighbor.







EXPANDING THE MISSION

By the Grace of God, since the founding of the mission in 2002, our Lord has indeed allowed tremendous growth to our little parish in the woods. The time has now come, as was the hope of our founding members, to complete the expansion of our Church Temple in order to accommodate an ever growing parish family!

WORSHIPING IN THE CENTER OF THE CROSS

Beginning in 2019, the parish began to make plans for a future expansion with the goal of doubling the size of our current worship space, while still maintaining the "Little" Church feel by keeping the faithful in close proximity to the altar. The expansion calls for each side of the existing temple to extend out into the shape of a cross, leaving us to worship in the very center of the cross which is where Christians belong!



WINDOWS INTO THE PAST Along with the new additions, we have been given the blessing to acquire the stain-glass icon windows from St. Tikhon's Monastery, the oldest Orthodox Monastery in the country, thus tying a small piece of History from the Orthodox Church in America to our little parish in the woods.

A TREMENDOUS Blessing

We have received a commitment from a private donor who has offered to match any donation dollar for dollar, up to \$500,000! If God so wills that we are able to make the most of this incredible gift, we should be able to cover the cost of the expansion without the need of a mortgage!





Guest Speaker: Fr. Bogdan Bucur

Fr. Bogdan Bucur is associate professor of Patristics at St Vladimir Orthodox Theological Seminary, Crestwood, NY since 2020. He is a priest of the Antiochian Archdiocese who received his M.Th. In Orthodox Theology at the University of Bucharest in his native Romania and then came to the United States to study under now-Archbishop Alexander (Golitzin) at Marquette University where he received his M.A. in Theology and Ph.D. in Religious Studies. Between 2007 and 2020, he was Assistant and then Associate Professor of Theology at Duquesne University, in Pittsburgh, where he worked in the areas of Early Christian Studies and Reception History of the Bible. In 2010 he was ordained a priest in the Antiochian Orthodox Archdiocese and served as the pastor of St Anthony Orthodox Church in Butler, PA (2010-2020). Fr Bogdan He is a scholar of early Christianity, with a special interest in the link between reception history of the Bible and doctrinal developments in early Christianity and the Byzantine tradition.

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
