THEOPHANY








THE JORDAN TURNED BACK



I happen to come across one of those ad laden internet rabbit hole posts that tried to convey through photos of the sheer and scary power of the sea. It showed pictures of large container ships being tossed around by 60 ft waves like they were toy ships, and how in the depths of the sea, objects are smashed as they succumb to the pressure of the deep!

The sea is a scary place even for us living in this age of technology, but it was even more an object of fear 3 and 4 millennia ago! In ancient times and writings, the sea represented "unformed chaos". Knowing this adds some context to the scripture. For example, we remember the lesson of Christ sending the demons from the demoniac into a herd of swine. The herd immediately rushed off of a cliff and into the Sea of Galilee! In this, we are meant to see that when the devil takes control of creation, the only place that it leads to is the "abyss". The demons lead our lives to chaos.



The prevailing thought in ancient times was that if you didn't want to succumb to the chaos of the waters, you needed to try and appease whatever demon gods controlled them. The Canaanites for example would offer sacrifices to the demon God "Yam" to carry favor with him so that their voyage would be blessed.

Praying to the demons wasn't just the case with water. In ancient times, you offered praise and sacrifice to whatever demon was in charge of what you desired. If you wanted good weather,

you would sacrifice bulls to Manuzi, the god of weather. If you wanted good crops, you would pray to Nikkal Wa-lb, the goddess of orchards and fruit. If you wanted a bright sunny day, you tried to appease Malakbel, the god of the sun. All of the various elements of the world were believed to be controlled by these demon spirits, to whom a good and easy life depended on.

Demon spirits controlling the vary faucets of existence was the prevailing thought in the world, until these pagan nations came face to face with the people of Israel, who began to show the world something completely different:

The existence of THE GOD! The God who created everything "Ex Nihilo", out of nothing! The one who didn't just control the waters like "Yam", but created them! He didn't control the crops like Nikkal Walb, but literally made the dirt that it grows in. God didn't just make the sun shine like Malakbel, He rather created the Sun itself!

The revelation of God (with a capital "G) blew the minds of the pagans! How is the God of Israel doing this?! The Egyptians watched as God, from the breath of his nostrils, split the Red Sea into two, and allowed his people to walk safely to the other side while simultaneously destroying the Egyptian Army. They asked Who is this God that He has power over "Nun", the Egyptian God of water?

In the book of Joshua, God orders that he take his people into the Holy Land after 40 years in the dessert. They didn't pray to the Yam to allow it to happen. The God of Israel rather tells the priests to simply take the ark of the covenant and cross over the river Jordan. As soon as their feet touch the water, the Jordan River turned back and they walked across!


The Prophet Elijah took his robe and struck the Jordan, and the waters turned back as if it was dry land, and him and Elisha crossed over. Not long after that, we are reminded of the time Elisha was cutting down trees near the Jordan, and one of the disciple's ax heads came off and sank in the middle of the river. Elisha cut off a piece of wood, threw it into the water, and the iron ax head defied nature itself and began to float, so the disciples could go and retrieve it.

The demons who once controlled the elements now find themselves subject to the very God who created everything! They come face to face with THE God of the whole world! This brings us to what we continue to celebrate this month, the feast of Holy Theophany which means "the appearance of God"

Christ comes into the midst of the waters and into direct contact with these fallen spirits. The Church, as if mocking the demons themselves, ask in the hymns: What ails you O sea, that you fled? And you Jordan, that you have turned back? It is as if the Church is saying to the demons "What's the matter? Your power is gone...and accounts to nothing when you come face to face with Christ!"

When God commands something into being, it happens. When he enters battle with the demon gods, there is no battle... simply defeat. God is victorious!

On Holy Theophany, the world learned that Jesus is that same God. He commands the winds of the sea. He has power over sickness and disease. As we will see in a couple months, He has power even over death. Jesus isn't some water or agricultural God that can make sure our life goes well and our crops grow, He is rather the God of all creation. Everything is subject to His command.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, other than an awesome history lesson that puts the Church Hymns into perspective, what does this mean for us?

- 1.) The Spiritual Forces that encompassed the natural world and the existence of demons are and always will be absolutely real. In many countries throughout the world, an understanding of the spiritual world is taken for granted... but or us living in a materialistic society, we tend to hide the existence of such things.
- 2.) Theophany reveals to us the very purpose of our existence! Through the very water that once represented chaos, Christ brings order to our life through Holy Baptism. He gives us all the chance to put off our old way of life that leads to the chaos of the fallen world, and to be reborn into a new life with God Himself. God calls us every day to be united to Him in a way, that like we see in the lives of the saints...the demons flee from us! The unformed chaos of the world is dispelled.

May the "Giver of Life enlighten us who have gone astray, and deliver us in His compassion from every snare of the dragon...Amen"



2023 PASTORAL REPORT

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GABRIEL
PRESENTED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING ON DECEMBER 3, 2023

"Prepare O Bethlehem, for Eden has been opened to all. Adorn yourself O Ephratha, for the tree of life blossoms forth from the Virgin in the Cave. Her womb is a spiritual paradise planted with the Divine Fruit. If we eat of it, we shall liver forever and not die like Adam. Christ comes to restore the image which He made in the beginning."

This pre-festal hymn for the Nativity is one that comes to mind as I gauge the tenor of where we are at as a parish family, after several years of the trials and stresses that come with being displaced from our house of worship. We have been preparing to enter back into paradise. The Church is now being adorned with finishes and iconography that will serve to remind us of the heavenly worship we are called to. Christ, through all the difficulties, trials, and tribulations, has remained with us...restoring the Church which He made in the beginning.

While this upcoming year will be one of the most monumental and exciting years of our parish community, my report today will be on all of what our Lord has allowed us to accomplish, despite our now 20 months in the "desert". As always, I believe there are four pillars of the Church that are absolutely necessary for growing closer to Christ, so I will be focusing my report on these pillars of Worship, Community, Education, and Stewardship.

Worship:

Despite all of the challenges (the lack of seating, the Heating and Cooling systems being overwhelmed by the volume of people, the lack of standing space, etc.) we have been able to maintain a full Liturgical Schedule, which includes not just weekend services, but also regular weekday Divine Liturgies and Feast Days throughout the entire year. Our choir continues to grow through more regular practices and increased communication and organization... which has truly made them one of the best choirs in the state. Our Church has been continually cleaned and adorned with flowers by a select group of volunteers who care for the beauty of our Lord's House. Our altar servers, despite the different layout of the Church, have been regular and dedicated. And most important, our overall attendance, despite it being like a "sardine can", has grown since we started worshiping in this temporary chapel.

I want to first ask your forgiveness for this building project taking as long as it has...and also thank you from the bottom of my heart for ignoring the temptations of the devil to skip out of Church because of the lack of space. Our time in the desert is coming to a close, and soon we will be welcomed back to the promised land, where we can further turn our attention to the growth of our worship of God in all things!

Community:

Since our last meeting, and including some that will be added in 2 weeks, we have been blessed to welcome 17 new Orthodox Christian warriors to the faith. We celebrated 3 marriages this past year, with 5 scheduled for this upcoming year. We also have a 24 catechumens who are in the midst of their journey to the Holy Orthodox Faith.

Again, despite our space limitations, we have maintained a semi-regular community event schedule that has helped to keep our people together. I look forward to getting back to our monthly Agape Meals and larger community events in the upcoming year.



2023 PASTORAL REPORT

FROM THE DESK OF FR. GABRIEL
PRESENTED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING ON DECEMBER 3, 2023

Stewardship:

The regular stewardship of the parish, as well as charitable activities, are outlined in the committee reports as well as the financial report. I will just take this moment to remind everyone of the tremendous amount of gifts that God has bestowed upon our parish family. Despite the obstacles that have been thrown in our path, we will somehow...someway...be coming out of this building project with a loan that will be less than 20% of our campus net worth. We still have a shortfall with which to overcome to gain occupancy, but through the continued generosity of our parish family as well as strangers from the outside, I have confidence that our Lord will continue to provide for the needs of this parish family.



Education:

We have had record numbers of people both in attendance and virtually that have been taking our Adult Education classes this past year. On top of our Metanoia Classes, which run in the Fall and the Winter, we also offered two mini-series this past year on "The Acts after the Acts of the Apostles", as well as the one we are currently doing: "The Hidden Prayers of the Divine Liturgy." I am grateful to God for those who are looking to continue to grow in their faith through spiritual education.

One of the beautiful things to see is that, despite the fact we have not had in class Church school due to lack of space, the children of this parish continue to amaze me with their knowledge and attention during the Divine Services. Every time a child comes to Divine Liturgy, they are being immersed in Holiness...and there is nothing better than hearing them shout out in song during the Holy God and the Our Father...it's a beautiful thing.


My thanks goes out to all of those who work diligently to educate our youngest members, and to the parents who continue to nurture their children's faith through regular attendance. I remind us all that these children are the future of the parish...and truly the future of the Holy Orthodox Way of Life...They are the ones who will be singing at our funerals, so keep them in the Church!

I also want to personally thank and show my love to my wife Matushka Laura, to Lucy, Noah, Ileana, and Elijah. The life of a priest's family is one that is extraordinarily difficult... Despite these difficulties, your grace, patience, understand, and love for me has been the only thing that has kept me afloat so that I can continue to serve the flock that we have been given here at St. Mary Magdalene. For that, I thank you, and I love you.

Dearest parish family, please forgive me for all of the ways in which I have failed to lead...for they are many and innumerable. Please continue to pray for me and my family as we, by God's Grace, continue to try to lead this community towards Theosis and Communion with the Divine.







Please feel free to reach out to me with questions, concerns and ideas.






Our Young adult group is for anyone ages 21-45 who wish to join in fellowship and faith.



Wednesday, February 7th: What do we believe about God? Wednesday, February 14th: What is mankind's purpose in life?


