

What is the value of Human Life?

As Christians, we know the verbal response to this question. **Every Human being** on this planet is precious to God...and is precious to all of us. We hear our Lord command us to *"Love one another as I have loved You"*, and with the people that are closest to us, this is a relatively easy task to accomplish! We learn in life to unconditionally love our spouses, our parents, our family, our friends. We recognize value in their lives because we are close to them. We share in their joys and laugh when they laugh. We hurt when they are hurt. We weep and beat our breast when they pass on to eternal life. But is their value any more than the stranger who yells at you in Walmart?

Do we show the same love to all those that we come into contact with, or are there those who we might pass by on the street, to whom we place no value on at all?

What is the value of Human Life?

I recently was sent a wonderful video in an email from a friend in New York with the memo line *"long...but worth watching"*. It was a recording of a conference in Greece with one of the pilgrims who visited and spent time with St. Paisios of the Holy Mountain, who was only recently canonized as a Saint, after passing away in 1994. This is a Saint of our lifetime, and not one who lived 15 centuries ago! Despite only being a saint for just a few years, his popularity in the world has taken off. The books about his life and his wisdom have been translated all throughout the Orthodox World and have sold countless millions of copies (20 million in Russia alone as of 5 years ago!)

Because I am often running around from one place to another, I don't often make the time to watch long internet videos, especially ones that are in Greek with English subtitles...but because I have such a love for this Saint, I decided to make an effort and to watch it for just a few minutes. In the end, I ended up sitting there in tears and with my mouth open for an hour and a half.

Through all of the countless miracles and stories that were told, perhaps the one that touched me the most was how evident St. Paisios's love was for every human life. During his time on Mount Athos, as well as the few times that he travelled off the mountain, this man was bombarded by hundreds and thousands of pilgrims a day. There were often days where, whether he was on the Holy Mountain or somewhere in a secular village, there would be a que of cars that stretched for 3 miles, and hundreds and thousands of pilgrims, who would spend 36 hours waiting to get just one minute with true holiness.

All of the people who came to St. Paisios had come for different reasons. Some were there because they had personal ailments or family members who needed prayers. Others came because they thought he was a fraud, and wanted to discredit him. There were even stories of Buddhist Monks who wanted to curse the Saint with Dark Magic! Regardless of what they were coming there for, St. Paisios would welcome every single one of them for days at a

time. During his last few years, he was weak from cancer and in a lot of pain, but he would still go outside of his hut and meet with everyone who came to see him, while holding onto an olive tree in order to keep himself upright.


What is the value of Human life?

Everyone of us who has come to one Divine Liturgy and opened up one chapter of scripture knows the answer to that question in their heart, but what makes the Saints different than each and every one of us, is that they answer it with **action**.

St. Paul speaks in the epistles about unique spiritual gifts that each of us are given by God to use to serve the Church, and to serve each other in love. One Christian might have the gift of compassion. When they hear something horrible that happened to a fellow human being, they offer words of consolation...and have the gift of encouraging people to live their lives again with new hope. Some have the spiritual gift of listening. Not everyone is a good listener...or has a calm disposition about life. These are the kinds of people that act as the gentle presence of Christ in the midst of chaos and are able to use the ministry of presence to help others by not adding chaos to an already chaotic situation.

St. Paisios used his spiritual gifts of prophecy and healing to listen to and help every person that came into contact with, regardless of their desires or needs. He showed his love to others by **action** and not by words.

How do we begin to recognize the value of Human Life? By using the gifts we have been given, to not only praise God's Holy Name, but to also learn to see Him everywhere in the world...most especially in each other. May we all continue to walk in the example of the Saints, and fulfill the commandment of St. Paul who tell us to let our love for one another be without hypocrisy.




What is Happening in the Pillar of Education?

A Simple Miracle in our Little Church in the Woods

On a daily basis, Our Lord gives us incredible assurances of His presence and Grace within us...but we are often so busy with the cares of the world that we don't recognize or acknowledge them. Occasionally however, there are some miracles that are just impossible to ignore...which brings me to a simple man named Clark.

About the time that we were moving our Church to it's temporary location, I was going through some of the multitude of service books that sit on a small little shelf that is kept behind the altar. Several of the books that are not used that often could be accessed off of the internet when needed...and didn't need to take up space on my shelf.

I came across an akathist service to the Mother of God Pantanassa (Queen of All), that was written for a special miracle working icon of the Theotokos from Russia and now resides on Mt. Athos. This miraculous icon is specifically known for healing of terminal diseases such as cancer. I briefly looked at the book and put it aside, thinking that this might be something I use in the future. I didn't have to wait long until a complete stranger walked into the Church that day with his wife and daughter. His name was Clark, and he had come often to the shrine of the Theotokos that we have in the back of the property just to sit, or to fish in the river that flows behind the Church. He told me that he had been diagnosed some time ago with terminal prostate cancer, and was asking for some prayers.

We went into the Church, and began to pray from the service book that I had discovered by accident a few hours earlier. Clark, who was clearly in a lot of pain, went down on his knees in front of the icon of the Theotokos while I sang the Akathist hymns and incensed our icon of the Mother of God. After the service, full of tears of thanksgiving, he was anointed with some of the miraculous oil from the Iveron Weeping Icon that we have at the Church, and left.

Just about once a week, Clark has come in to the Church during the week to pray the Akathist with me and to be anointed. Some days he can only manage to go through part of the hymns before his pain gets to him...while other days he is able to kneel for the entire service.

On Thursday, June 23rd, I just finished the prayers for Clark, where afterwards he informed me that his PSA levels have dramatically dropped, almost to the point of normal levels. He graciously and tearfully gave thanks to the Great Physician, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, and for The blessed mother's prayers...and is now in the early stages of walking the path to recovery.

I share this story this as a reminder of God's Grace which continually pours itself upon mankind. There isn't a priest alive that hasn't seen hundreds of these kinds of miracles poured out upon the faithful...and I am grateful that God revealed this assurance of His presence to me, through His servant Clark.

FELLOWSHIP AGAPE MEALS

Agape (Greek agapē): in the New Testament, the fatherly love of God for humans, as well as the human reciprocal love for God. In Scripture, the transcendent agape love is the highest form of love and is contrasted with eros, or erotic love, and philia, or brotherly love.

Sobornost: Divine-Human Oneness

Sobornost means spiritual harmony based on freedom and unity in love. It is a necessary component in our membership with the Body of Christ, for if we are not bound together in love, our freedom becomes our enemy, separating us from others and ultimately from Christ Himself. This concept was so important to early Christians that it was the basis for the agape meal, when Christians shared their food with one another after the celebration of the eucharistic banquet.

That the pre-communion fast would be broken after the Divine Liturgy with a communal meal (the love feast) clearly demonstrates the importance of community within the life of the Church. Sobornost is the divine human oneness we experience as members of the on Body, the Church, and is the moment when we who are many become one. It is the image of the unity of the Holy Trinity, finding its expression among the believers.

Sobornost is not the same as fraternity, a submission to a brotherhood for benefit of the individual. Rather, it is akin to *kenosis* (the relinquishment of divine attributes by Jesus Christ in becoming human) Sobornost is when the individual gives up self-benefit for the community or ecclesia.

We cannot truly be one in Christ if we do not seek out oneness with our fellow Christians. Nor can we be one with Christ if we routinely reject sobornost for heights of spirituality that make us so conscious of self that they separate us from our neighbor.

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
