

Adding Color to the Scripture on the Annunciation

From the Desk of Fr. Gabriel

Later in the month of March, we celebrate the Great Feast of the Annunciation. This pivotal moment in human history, when the Angel Gabriel came to Mary to announce that she was to be the chosen vessel of which God was to come into the world, is hard to understand from a human perspective! No amount of science or logical can explain or comprehend how The Uncontainable God...the same that created both the heavens and the earth... comes to be in the womb of a Virgin!

Every year, I am always particularly struck by the texts of the Canon in the Matins service of Annunciation. The Festal Canon is somewhat unique, because all of the hymns contained in it are set up as a dialogue between the Angel and Mary. While scripture might offer us the words that were spoken, it is these hymns that truly add some color to the entire picture!

Let's set the scene of what we get from the Gospel. A young but very faithful virgin is sitting and sewing a curtain for the temple (as depicted in the icon). A bright angel appears and tells her: "Rejoice highly favored one...the Lord is with you! Blessed are you among women! Don't be afraid, for you have found favor with God. Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bring forth a Son, and shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Highest, and the Lord God will give Him the throne of His father David...and He will reign over a house of Jacob forever, and of His kingdom there will be no end!"

Now, let the Festal Canon of Matins provide some depth and color:

Theotokos: "There is no more a prince from Judah's line, but the time is at hand in which Christ, the hope of the Gentiles, shall appear. But can you make it plain to me how I, being a virgin, shall bear him?"

Angel Gabriel: "O virgin, you seek to know from me the manner of your conceiving, but this is beyond all interpretation. The Holy Spirit shall overshadow you in His creative power and shall make this come to pass!"

Theotokos: "My mother Eve, accepting the suggestion of the serpent, was banished from divine delight: and therefore I fear you strange salutation, for I take heed lest I slip!"

Angel Gabriel: "I am sent as the envoy of God to disclose to thee the divine will. Why are you, O undefiled, afraid of me, who rather am afraid of you? Why, o Lady, do you stand in awe of me, who stand in reverent awe of you?"

Adding Color to the Scripture on the Annunciation cont.

The Church beautifully adds to this incredible scene, showing that even the Angel Gabriel was in awe at what was happening! God coming down and taking His abode in the womb of a simple teenager!

Here's the lesson for us today: Despite all of these things that were beyond the comprehension of even the angels, what was Mary's response? "Behold the maidservant of the Lord! Let it be to be according to Your Word!" Simple and PERFECT faith.

I often wonder what would have been our response. An angel appears to us and says: "You will be the vessel in which God will enter into the world!"

Our response? "How do I know you are really an angel? How will I avoid ridicule and judgment from my friends and family, which will no doubt rain upon me who am a virgin? Will He be born before January first and can I still claim the Child Tax Credit at the end of the year?!" All manner of responses tied up in our own selfish desires, doubts, and lack of faith, all of which emulated the thoughts of Adam and Eve, who desired paradise and union with God, but wanted to do so **without** the Faith that God would provide it in the fullness of time.

We have to be better than that, and this is why we hold Mary up as the Greatest Saint in the Church. She is the perfect Christian because she lived in the same doubting world that we are a part of, and was able to counter the poking and prodding of the devil, who tempts us day after day to give up on our faith. The Theotokos was able to defeat the deceiver that day, and throughout all of her life, by escaping her head and learning to live with God in her heart. She learned how to defy logic, and live in faith. This is the state that we as Christians will spend the rest of our lives trying to achieve.

We do not look on the Theotokos as "an example" but rather "**THE** example" of how strong and steadfast our faith needs to be.





Clean Week Attendance:

The first week of Great Lent offers us daily services of repentance in order to set ourselves up for the journey ahead. This week is a vital week, and I HIGHLY ENCOURAGE OUR ENTIRE PARISH COMMUNITY to attend ALL OF THE SERVICES that are being offered for this week. I promise you that there is nothing more important in your life on the week of March 6th, then to be present in the Church.

Friday Night PreSanctified and Potlucks:

Starting with our first Friday Pre-Sanctified on March 11th, we will be having a pot luck after the evening Liturgies. Please plan on bringing a lenten dish to pass and to share as we gather as a community after receiving the Divine Eucharist! Remember to fast after your noon meal if you plan on receiving the Eucharist at PreSanctified Liturgies.

All Parish Meeting

There will be an all parish meeting on **Sunday, March 20th** immediately following the Divine Liturgy to discuss the next steps in the building expansion. These decisions must be made as a whole body of the parish family. Please reach out to Fr. Gabriel with any questions.

While February was a relatively quiet month for community events, we did have a very well attended and wonderful outing at the Detroit Pistons game. Thank you to all who helped to make that possible.


What is Happening in the Pillar of Education?


What is Happening in the Pillar of Stewardship?



Lent begins on March 6, Forgiveness Sunday and the children will remain in Church to participate in the Rite of Forgiveness, a very special way to begin our journey through Great Lent as a Church family. The children will also remain in church on March 13 to celebrate Orthodoxy Sunday. Church School Class will resume on March 20 with a lesson about the Feast of the Annunciation and on March 27 the lesson will be about the Sacrament of Confession. The children preparing for First Confession will meet on those days during church school as they continue to learn about why this Sacrament is so necessary for our growth in the faith.

The children will continue to work with Anna Hamann on music for Palm Sunday. She will work with them during church school time so it becomes doubly important that children are at church school each week.

This month the children will be learning about the sacraments of Marriage and Ordination. There will also be a lesson on the Orthodox view of death and how we remember the dead (requiem) in the church and our lives. The final lesson of the month is on Forgiveness based on Colossians 3:13. This topic will lead us into the beginning of Lent on March 6, Forgiveness Sunday. Church school will NOT meet on that day as we all take part in the Rite of Forgiveness following Divine Liturgy. This beautiful tradition is a perfect beginning to our Lenten Journey.

We look forward to seeing all the children and thank you all for supporting their participation in Church School. A child's first and best teachers about the faith are their parents and there is no better place for all of us to learn than in church.





Guest Speaker: Fr. Bogdan Bucur

Fr. Bogdan Bucur is associate professor of Patristics at St Vladimir Orthodox Theological Seminary, Crestwood, NY since 2020. He is a priest of the Antiochian Archdiocese who received his M.Th. In Orthodox Theology at the University of Bucharest in his native Romania and then came to the United States to study under now-Archbishop Alexander (Golitzin) at Marquette University where he received his M.A. in Theology and Ph.D. in Religious Studies. Between 2007 and 2020, he was Assistant and then Associate Professor of Theology at Duquesne University, in Pittsburgh, where he worked in the areas of Early Christian Studies and Reception History of the Bible. In 2010 he was ordained a priest in the Antiochian Orthodox Archdiocese and served as the pastor of St Anthony Orthodox Church in Butler, PA (2010-2020). Fr Bogdan He is a scholar of early Christianity, with a special interest in the link between reception history of the Bible and doctrinal developments in early Christianity and the Byzantine tradition.

FELLOWSHIP AGAPE MEALS

Agape (Greek agapē): in the New Testament, the fatherly love of God for humans, as well as the human reciprocal love for God. In Scripture, the transcendent agape love is the highest form of love and is contrasted with eros, or erotic love, and philia, or brotherly love.

Sobornost: Divine-Human Oneness

Sobornost means spiritual harmony based on freedom and unity in love. It is a necessary component in our membership with the Body of Christ, for if we are not bound together in love, our freedom becomes our enemy, separating us from others and ultimately from Christ Himself. This concept was so important to early Christians that it was the basis for the agape meal, when Christians shared their food with one another after the celebration of the eucharistic banquet.

That the pre-communion fast would be broken after the Divine Liturgy with a communal meal (the love feast) clearly demonstrates the importance of community within the life of the Church. Sobornost is the divine human oneness we experience as members of the on Body, the Church, and is the moment when we who are many become one. It is the image of the unity of the Holy Trinity, finding its expression among the believers.

Sobornost is not the same as fraternity, a submission to a brotherhood for benefit of the individual. Rather, it is akin to *kenosis* (the relinquishment of divine attributes by Jesus Christ in becoming human) Sobornost is when the individual gives up self-benefit for the community or ecclesia.

We cannot truly be one in Christ if we do not seek out oneness with our fellow Christians. Nor can we be one with Christ if we routinely reject sobornost for heights of spirituality that make us so conscious of self that they separate us from our neighbor.
