

Leaving No Doubt

From the Desk of Fr. Gabriel

Christ is Risen! Can there be any doubt of that reality?! How incredible of a feeling it was to celebrate the Resurrection! Pascha isn't just another Holy day...it is an experience. It brings about in all of us a special change that can only be brought on when God rises from the dead!

We read in the post crucifixion accounts of the Gospels what happens to people after they experienced and came into the presence of the Risen Lord. Before Jesus made his appearance after His crucifixion St. Mary Magdalene was filled with grief and doubt that her master was dead. Travelling on the road to Emmaus, two men were in complete despair as they were lamenting how the great deliverer had been arrested, tortured, and crucified. In the Gospel for St. Thomas Sunday, we hear how the Disciples (our Lord's most ardent followers) hid themselves in the upper room out of sadness and fear of the Jews. They thought to themselves: "If the Jews were capable of doing these things to the master, imagine what kind of horrors they would inflict to His servants!"

What do we see happen to all of these men and women after they come to experience the Risen Christ and His presence among them? His presence transformed our weeping patroness St. Mary Magdalene into a disciple with unbounded joy. The power of the resurrection eventually led her to shed all fear in life and proclaim the Risen Christ in the audience of Caesar Tiberias himself!

Christ's Risen presence transformed the hearts of the two travelers on the road to Emmaus. After not recognizing that it was Jesus who had appeared and spoke to them, they asked themselves: "Did not our hearts burn within us while He talked with us on the road, and while He opened the scripture to us?"

Look what His presence did to the Disciples who were locked in and afraid to open the door! They went from broken and disheartened, to strong, confident, and bold lions of faith! Even after our Lord ascended into heaven, the disciples sang, rejoiced, healed, and taught the masses, and they did it not just for a few days after the resurrection, but for the rest of their lives! All of them (except one) joyfully went to their martyrdom, proclaiming this reality! Why?Because the presence, the experience, and the power of the Risen Lord would live through them for eternity.

Every year, we bless this large loaf of bread called the "Artos" towards the end of the Paschal Liturgy. It remains in the Church itself until after Bright Week, when we take it, break it amongst ourselves, and are reminded of the sweetness of Pascha once again. This tradition came about from the Apostles themselves, who after our Lord ascended into heaven would always leave a plate at the end of the table during their common meals. On the plate would be a piece of bread, reminding them of Christ's Presence among them!





THE MOUNTAIN OF SILENCE: A SEARCH FOR ORTHODOX SPIRITUALITY

BY KYRIACOS MARKIDES

An acclaimed expert in Christian mysticism travels to a monastery high in the Mountains of Cyprus and offers a fascinating look at the Greek Orthodox approach to spirituality.

In an engaging combination of dialogues, reflections, conversations, history, and travel information, the author follows Father Maximos, a Mount Athos monk, to the troubled island of Cyprus. As Father Maximos establishes churches, convents, and monasteries in this deeply divided land, Markides is awakened anew to the magnificent spirituality of the Greek Orthodox Church.

Images of the land and the people of Cyprus and details of its tragic history enrich the Mountain of Silence. Like the writings of Castaneda, the book brilliantly evokes the confluence of an inner and outer journey. The depth and richness of its spiritual message echo the thoughts and writings of Saint Francis of Assisi and other great saints of the Church as well. The result is a remarkable work—a moving, profoundly human examination of the role and the power of spirituality in a complex and confusing world.

FELLOWSHIP AGAPE MEALS

Agape (Greek agapē): in the New Testament, the fatherly love of God for humans, as well as the human reciprocal love for God. In Scripture, the transcendent agape love is the highest form of love and is contrasted with eros, or erotic love, and philia, or brotherly love.

Sobornost: Divine-Human Oneness

Sobornost means spiritual harmony based on freedom and unity in love. It is a necessary component in our membership with the Body of Christ, for if we are not bound together in love, our freedom becomes our enemy, separating us from others and ultimately from Christ Himself. This concept was so important to early Christians that it was the basis for the agape meal, when Christians shared their food with one another after the celebration of the eucharistic banquet.

That the pre-communion fast would be broken after the Divine Liturgy with a communal meal (the love feast) clearly demonstrates the importance of community within the life of the Church. Sobornost is the divine human oneness we experience as members of the on Body, the Church, and is the moment when we who are many become one. It is the image of the unity of the Holy Trinity, finding its expression among the believers.

Sobornost is not the same as fraternity, a submission to a brotherhood for benefit of the individual. Rather, it is akin to *kenosis* (the relinquishment of divine attributes by Jesus Christ in becoming human) Sobornost is when the individual gives up self-benefit for the community or ecclesia.

We cannot truly be one in Christ if we do not seek out oneness with our fellow Christians. Nor can we be one with Christ if we routinely reject sobornost for heights of spirituality that make us so conscious of self that they separate us from our neighbor.







EXPANDING THE MISSION

By the Grace of God, since the founding of the mission in 2002, our Lord has indeed allowed tremendous growth to our little parish in the woods. The time has now come, as was the hope of our founding members, to complete the expansion of our Church Temple in order to accommodate an ever growing parish family!

WORSHIPING IN THE CENTER OF THE CROSS

Beginning in 2019, the parish began to make plans for a future expansion with the goal of doubling the size of our current worship space, while still maintaining the "Little" Church feel by keeping the faithful in close proximity to the altar. The expansion calls for each side of the existing temple to extend out into the shape of a cross, leaving us to worship in the very center of the cross which is where Christians belong!



WINDOWS INTO THE PAST

Along with the new additions, we have been given the blessing to acquire the stain-glass icon windows from St. Tikhon's Monastery, the oldest Orthodox Monastery in the country, thus tying a small piece of History from the Orthodox Church in America to our little parish in the woods.

A TREMENDOUS BLESSING

We have received a commitment from a private donor who has offered to match any donation dollar for dollar, up to \$500,000! If God so wills that we are able to make the most of this incredible gift, we should be able to cover the cost of the expansion without the need of a mortgage!
