Don't Poke the Bear

From the Desk of Fr. Gabriel

During a monthly visit over coffee with a local pastor friend of mine, I was a bit disturbed to learn of a new store that went up in a neighboring community that was dedicated to selling items used for witchcraft and seances. As if that wasn't enough, I was bombarded a day later with brochures describing an upcoming "Witches Ball" as well as invitations to a group that teaches people special dances to call upon the spirits for Halloween! All of these events have led me to offer this small word of warning to anyone reading this: **Do not fall prey to this ignorance dear ones!**

Our society at large tends to think of witches, demons, ghouls, and spirits as harmless games and fun. Orthodox Christians understand from experience however, that these things are incredibly dangerous. When we are invited to events or parties that deal with spirits, whether it is organized in complete knowledge of what is being done, or out of ignorance in the spirit of fun, we must ask ourselves: *"Why would I go to poke the bear?"*

As we get closer and closer to the end of October, allow me to give this annual public service announcement. **Demons and Evil spirits are absolutely, positively, without a shadow of a doubt, REAL.** They surround us like vultures, waiting to crash down on those who show either weakness in the spiritual life, or (worse yet) attacking those who playfully deny their existence. With that in mind, here are three things to remember about the existence of demons and how we are to react to them.

1.) If you look for them, they will very easily find you!

In the very popular book "Everyday Saints", the young student Tikhon talks about his experience with calling upon the spirits prior to his conversion to Orthodoxy. His group of friends spent time researching and learning how to do seances so that they could establish a connection with spirits, and eventually they were quite successful! In their seances, they would have conversations with entities that called themselves "Napoleon" or "Socrates". These spirits would even tell them intimate details about their personal lives as well as details about the future. Tikhon and his friends didn't truly know what they were getting into, but one thing was for certain...their moods changed after the seances began. Depression and darkness that could not be described in words had slowly started to creep into their lives, and what started with innocent curiosity eventually ended in a very scary situation.

If you go looking for demons, they will find you. St. Paisius of Neamt, an 18th century saint, once said:

"Do you not know with whom you battle? How legions of invisible enemies surround you, and every one of them wages his own battle? They sound numberless voices, and desire to swallow up your soul. Should you not be cautious? Is it possible that having drunk your fill and given yourself over to sleep, lying down and constantly consoling yourself, that you can with all of this, receive salvation? If you will not be attentive to this...you will never escape their traps!"

2.) The Only Thing that Demons are Capable of is Destruction During one of the seances, the spirit of Nikolai Gogol, a famous Russian author, came into the midst of the students. He was in tremendous pain, asking the students for help. Being an author whom Tikhon and his friends greatly admired, they wanted to do everything they could to help him! When they offered their assistance, Gogol asked them to join him so that they could help and offered to find them some poison to drink.

This leads us to the second thing we must remember about demons, and perhaps the sole reason you do everything in your power not to "poke the bear": The only thing that demons are capable of is destruction. They cannot love. They cannot lift us up. They cannot fill our lives with light or life. Their only aim is to destroy. This was the case with Tikhon and his friends, who had a demon ask them for life itself...seeking their destruction through suicide.

3.) A Savior is Needed to Escape Their Destruction

Tikhon tells how as soon as the students realized what was going on, that the spirit of Gogol was asking for their lives, they ran. Tikhon ended up running to the one place he knew he would receive deliverance: The Church.

"I went to the Savior. Using that name "Savior" so often, even Christians lose connection to the word's original and real meaning. But now, it was the most desired and most important word: Savior. We knew, however fantastic it might sound, that we were being hunted by powerful and unknown malevolent spirits, from whom only God our Savior could deliver us."

When we run into any trouble in life, not just with an encounter with a demon, but even struggles of doubt, or health difficulties, or depression, we need to **run to our Savior**. We run to the Church, which acts as a warm blanket of protection to the dark cold of the world.

The Church has given us so many weapons with which to combat the demons. When the priest gets vested before a Divine Liturgy, he is literally putting on armor to combat the darkness! As laity, each of us should also be the member of the NPRA (the National Prayer Rope Association), because our prayer ropes are an amazing weapon against the wiles of the enemy! We must use these to our advantage as often as we can!

And so, as society gets ever closer to the end of October, be cautious dear ones, and do not poke the bear! Rather seek consolation and love in the light that is offered to us every time we enter our prayer corners, every time we enter into Church, and every time we come into the Destroyer of Demons, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! ST SILOUAN THE ATHONITE (SOPHRONY)

In the autumn of 1892 a young Russian peasant named Simeon from the province of Tambov was drawn to that ancient repository of Orthodox spirituality, Mt Athos. He had done his military service and now came to the Russian Monastery of St Panteleimon, to embark on long years of spiritual combat lasting until his death in 1938. Although he was unlearned and ignorant in the ordinary sense, tireless inner striving gave him authentic personal experience of Christianity identical with that of many of the early ascetic Desert Fathers.

The first part of this book is a remarkable account of St Silouan's life, personality and teaching by his spiritual disciple Archimandrite Sophrony. Archimandrite Sophrony went to Mt Athos in 1925 and there at the Monastery of St Panteleimon became amanuensis to Staretz Silouan.

Part two comprises the writings of Silouan, originally penciled in laborious, unformed characters on odd scraps of paper. The Lord said, "Every one that is of the truth hears my voice" (John 18:37). And according to Father Sophrony, "these words are applicable to Staretz Silouan's notes ... [That] whoever has received from God the mind and wisdom to know him will be aware in the Staretz' words of the breath of the Holy Spirit."


As we are in the midst of our building project, we have had to limit some of the community events that we typically hold annually. One of the events that we were able to go forward with was the 6th annual Molebin to St. Mammas and Pet Blessing at the Fenton Adopt a Pet! This event was co-sponsored by Uncle Ray's Dairyland, who provided special treats for all of the animals and owners who were in attendance. This event has had strong participation every year it has occurred, and continues to be a wonderful witness of our faith in the community.

What is Happening in the Pillar of Education?

This past month, our Metanoia classes had begun, and have had great attendance thus far. This class serves multiple purposes. 2022 Budget Update As of September 23, 2022



September 23, 2022

Dear Parish,

We love our church as a place of Orthodox worship, education, service, and fellowship. We are a tithing church, and through Christ, we have been financially sound. We were able to pay off the mortgage from the original construction early, and save enough money to begin the current expansion. A wonderful feature of our parish culture is that we automatically give, without any prompting from our priest.

For this tradition to continue, the parish council is now requesting your help. On Sunday December 5, 2021, we voted to approve an annual budget of \$238,451 to operate the church in 2022. This does not count the Building Fund, which is a separate capital budget. To meet our 2022 operating budget, we should collect on average \$19,871 per month in tithes and donations. Through September 23, we have collected an average of \$18,762 per month, which leaves us \$9,707 short of where we should be at this time. To catch up, we need to collect \$22,858 per month on average for the remaining months.

We, your parish council, understand that these are somewhat uncertain times and so we would like to respectfully ask those of you that may currently have the means, to consider increasing your tithe or making a one time donation to help bridge the gap to the budget that we all approved as a parish last December. Together we can do this!

St. Mary Magdalene Church School began with a Meet and Greet on Sunday September 25. It was so good to see all the children. We are once again blessed with teachers who happily work to educate our children in the faith.

I want to make you aware of a few changes this year. Many things are happening in the Education Center during the church expansion including Divine Liturgy and coffee hour. Adding Church School to the mix requires some adjustments. Children will still leave for class directly after Communion. We all need to encourage them to leave quietly as they come to class as church is not finished and we want to keep the noise to a minimum. Class times will be shortened to 15 minutes for the preschool class (or until liturgy is finished) and about 30 minutes for the other classes. We will not be handing out snacks this year so that teachers have the full amount of time for the lesson. The preschool through 1st grade class will be meeting in Father's office and parents can pick their children up there after liturgy. The lower elementary class will meet in the middle classroom and the upper elementary class will meet in the library.

Class will meet on Sunday from October 2 through Sunday November 20. The lessons in October will be based on the Epistles to the Romans and First Corinthians. Second Corinthians, Galatians and Ephesians will be the sources used in November. Trunk or Treat will follow church school on October 30. As always, it will be a busy time in the parish.







FELLOWSHIP AGAPE MEALS

Agape (Greek agapē): in the New Testament, the fatherly love of God for humans, as well as the human reciprocal love for God. In Scripture, the transcendent agape love is the highest form of love and is contrasted with eros, or erotic love, and philia, or brotherly love.

Sobornost: Divine-Human Oneness

Sobornost means spiritual harmony based on freedom and unity in love. It is a necessary component in our membership with the Body of Christ, for if we are not bound together in love, our freedom becomes our enemy, separating us from others and ultimately from Christ Himself. This concept was so important to early Christians that it was the basis for the agape meal, when Christians shared their food with one another after the celebration of the eucharistic banquet.

That the pre-communion fast would be broken after the Divine Liturgy with a communal meal (the love feast) clearly demonstrates the importance of community within the life of the Church. Sobornost is the divine human oneness we experience as members of the on Body, the Church, and is the moment when we who are many become one. It is the image of the unity of the Holy Trinity, finding its expression among the believers.

Sobornost is not the same as fraternity, a submission to a brotherhood for benefit of the individual. Rather, it is akin to *kenosis* (the relinquishment of divine attributes by Jesus Christ in becoming human) Sobornost is when the individual gives up self-benefit for the community or ecclesia.

We cannot truly be one in Christ if we do not seek out oneness with our fellow Christians. Nor can we be one with Christ if we routinely reject sobornost for heights of spirituality that make us so conscious of self that they separate us from our neighbor.

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
