A Parent's Love for Their Children From the Desk of Fr. Gabriel

Children, whether they are given to us as parents, or spiritually adopted as God parents, are without a doubt a tremendous gift from God. And just like all of the gifts that we are given from above, whether it is a family, a home, a gift of love, or even the gift of a new day (which all of us here have been given today), the most important thing for us to remember is what to do with these gifts we have been given. As parents and Godparents, the answer is given to us. We are called to take the gift of children and to show, by the way we live our own lives, what the Love of God looks like. What better way to learn how to do that then by recalling the life of "the disciple whom Jesus loved", and who's falling asleep we remember on September 26th, St. John the Theologian.

St. John is often called the Disciple of Love, not only because of his preaching, but also because of the role models that he had to learn from! Who better to learn what love is than from Jesus Christ Himself! John was an eyewitness to the greatest act of Love the universe had ever known, when he stood at the foot of the cross!

Not to be outdone by Christ, St. John was then given another Mother at the cross, when Christ told him to take Mary the Theotokos into his home. Imagine having gone from learning about love, first from God Himself, and second from Our Lord's Mother who spent her own life radiating the Love of her Son to the world!

There is a story in St. John's life after he returned from Patmos, that speaks to our role in the Church as it relates to our love of children. St. John was visiting one of the Churches in Smyrna, when he noticed this young boy who seemed to have a very natural love for God. He turned to the local bishop at the time and said: "I am entrusting you with this boy, in the presence of this entire Church, Christ is my witness!"

The bishop did what he was told, and looked after the boy, instructing him in the Church and eventually baptizing him in the faith. But as so often and sadly happens in our own day and age, this is where the bishop's involvement in the child's spiritual life ended. He eventually lost track of the boy, who met up with the wrong crowd, and eventually became the leader of a desert gang who was responsible for various raids, theft, and murder throughout the region.

After some time had passed, St. John returned to Smyrna, only to find out the fate of this young man. What do you think his reaction was? St. John was in his 90s at the time, nearing the end of his life, and here was this youth who he had barely known! What did he owe this child?

St. John, the disciple of Love, understood that we as parents, Godparents, and as a community, have a God given responsibility to protect the gift of Children that we have been given. So, after learning where this gang typically settled, this 90 year old disciple got on a horse and went out into the desert. St. John was captured by the lookouts and he asked them to take him to their leader.

A Parent's Love for Their Children Cont.

When he was brought into the presence of the youth, the young man recognized the Saint immediately. The love St. John had shown him as a youth immediately penetrated all of the years of darkness that he had been living in. The young man turned around, and ran away in shame, but St. John ran after him saying:

"My son...why are you running away from your father? I am old and unarmed...have pity on my son and do not fear me! You can still hope in salvation...I would willingly die for you, just as Christ had died for us. I would give my soul for you!"

The young man stopped, hung his head, threw aside his weapon, and with tears, he threw himself into the Apostles embrace.

Trembling with emotion, he repented and asked forgiveness. That day, the young man received a second baptism with his own tears.

This is an incredible story from the life of St. John, that gives us two important lessons to remember when it comes to our children.

- 1.) The way to show love and honor to the gift of children that we have been given by God Himself, is by having them grow up and instructed by God Himself in the Church. It is here where they learn what **Love** is...what **Truth** is...and what **Community** looks like. If we ignore this calling and don't bring up our children in the Church, it is the world that will teach them. When they eventually fall away, how much more difficult it will be for them to come back?
- 2.)If and when the faith of our children waivers by the temptations of the world...chase after them dear ones. We show our love for them, even when they are running away from us, to remind them of the love that they once had in the embrace of Christ and His Church.

Through the prayers of St. John, the Disciple of Love, may our Lord save and protect us and our children!




RECOMMENDED READING

BY ELDER CLEOPA OF ROMANIA

PASTORAL REFLECTIONS ON THE FOUR PILLARS OF CHURCH GROWTH

What is Happening in the Pillar of Worship?

The past few weeks, we have had a whirlwind of activity at the Church. Rdr. Gregory and I attended the All American Council in Baltimore, where we were able to participate in daily Liturgies with Bishops, Priests, and Laity. Leaving Baltimore, although exhausted, I felt a bit recharged in terms of the future of our Orthodox Church in America, and in specific, our little parish in the woods.

We received relics of the vestments of St. Seraphim of Sarov, as well as relics of St. Silouan of Mt. Athos, and small relics of St. Innocent of Irkursk. When we have some financing, it would be nice to get some reliquaries or some icons for these relics.

August was also extremely busy in terms of special feast days. We celebrated together the Great Feast of Holy Transfiguration, as well as had a large gathering of our faithful at the Monastery of the Holy Dormition in Rives Junction, MI. Celebrating the feast at the monastery was a tremendous blessing, and it was extremely encouraging to see so many of our faithful parishioners take part in the festivities!

What is Happening in the Pillar of Community?


This past month, our parish family said goodbye to The Hamann family as they began their studies at St. Tikhon's Seminary for the next 3 years. We also lost a dear parishioner in Taisa Cuzbenko, who's funeral services were held in Fowlerville. On a bright note, we do have several inquirers, a few of which would like to be added to the catechumenate in the coming weeks. We brought back our parish family campout this last month with great success as we were able to fill 16 campsites with over 45 people!

What is Happening in the Pillar of Education?

By the grace of God, we completed our Vacation Church School One day program at the campgrounds! The theme was "Through the Cross", where our children learned all about the Feast of the Exaltation, and what the Cross offers us in our everyday lives. My thanks and congratulations goes out to all who helped to organize, and to all of our families who participated! This month, our Metanoia classes begin again after a long summer hiatus. This year, we will be using the works of Elder Cleopa of Romania to better understands the ins and outs of our faith.

What is Happening in the Pillar of Stewardship?

The Church was able to start the Hamann Family off with a collection on their last Sunday that should help significantly with moving expenses and to get them started up there while they settle in. We also thank all those who donated school supplies for our back to school drive!

Glory Be To Jesus Christ! Glory Forever!

The church building project is underway with the foundation for the addition coming along nicely. Soon, we will be able to see the expanded footprint for our beautiful church in the woods!

The Parish Council is requesting your continued support and is providing a status update on construction costs and funds. Here is our current situation:

- +Currently we have \$503k in cash that should last us through the end of September at the current progress of construction. We have spent \$158k so far towards the main building.
- +We have been approved for a \$350k loan through the Orthodox Church Capital Improvement Fund. This puts our total buying power at \$1,011,000.
- +The estimated cost for the entire project is about \$1,100,000. Estimated costs almost always change in projects like this. Once framing has begun this fall, many planning contingencies will be resolved, and it will be easier to estimate remaining costs with more precision. We will update the estimated cost in October.

Based on the newest figures, the Parish Council is asking you to consider making additional contributions to the Church Building Fund so that we can meet the following goals. If we can raise an additional \$90,000, we will be in a better position to proceed without making changes to plans or schedule. If we raise more than this, we could potentially reduce the size of the loan, which would reduce the loan payment, expected to be about \$2,260 per month.

We will re-evaluate this plan in October when we have more precise information. At that point we can adjust as needed (e.g., delay some items, cut some finishes, or seek other funding sources). Any contributions to the Building Fund made before October will greatly assist our long term financial health and will help our construction planning as we expand our beautiful church in the woods!

As we enter our final year of seminary, we would like to provide an update on our journey and express our gratitude for your continued support. I have had the privilege of serving as a deacon these past summer months at St. John of the Ladder Orthodox Church in Greenville, SC. Under the mentorship of Fr. Marcus Burch, I was privileged to not just serve in St. John's plentiful and beautiful liturgical life, but to spend time with many folks in various pastoral settings, be it from your typical coffee hour to visiting the sick and shut ins. But perhaps the biggest news is what, or who, comes in a few weeks. As of now, Mat. Danielle and I's first child, our daughter Cordelia, is expected no later than September 15th! We are both eager for her arrival and the blessings (and, let's be honest, challenges) she will bring. To welcome her into the world we have also been blessed to get an upgrade in our living situation: we have moved into a new and larger apartment at the seminary. So we can at least now say that Cordelia has a proper nursery. That was a fun room to set up, by the way, and by the grace of God my parents were able to travel to NY to help us get situated and moved in.

Lastly, God-willing, I will begin the process of petitioning for ordination to the priesthood this semester. I fervently ask your prayers and petitions during these coming months. Between physical fatherhood and spiritual fatherhood, I expect I will need as much grace as my soul can receive. Moreover, through your prayers and support we have taken on zero debt while in seminary. We genuinely cannot express our gratitude, and we continue to rely on your generosity as we wrap up this final year. Through your support, we are confident we will be in the best position to go obediently where the Church needs us to serve. We hope to see you all in the near future, and we continue to pray for you all as you make progress with the expanded temple.

The Parish Kiosk was moved to the hallway in the temporary chapel. We still have a wide array of treasures available from books to home altar supplies to icons.






Altar Servers Class 3:00pm

FELLOWSHIP AGAPE MEALS

Agape (Greek agapē): in the New Testament, the fatherly love of God for humans, as well as the human reciprocal love for God. In Scripture, the transcendent agape love is the highest form of love and is contrasted with eros, or erotic love, and philia, or brotherly love.

Sobornost: Divine-Human Oneness

Sobornost means spiritual harmony based on freedom and unity in love. It is a necessary component in our membership with the Body of Christ, for if we are not bound together in love, our freedom becomes our enemy, separating us from others and ultimately from Christ Himself. This concept was so important to early Christians that it was the basis for the agape meal, when Christians shared their food with one another after the celebration of the eucharistic banquet.

That the pre-communion fast would be broken after the Divine Liturgy with a communal meal (the love feast) clearly demonstrates the importance of community within the life of the Church. Sobornost is the divine human oneness we experience as members of the on Body, the Church, and is the moment when we who are many become one. It is the image of the unity of the Holy Trinity, finding its expression among the believers.

Sobornost is not the same as fraternity, a submission to a brotherhood for benefit of the individual. Rather, it is akin to *kenosis* (the relinquishment of divine attributes by Jesus Christ in becoming human) Sobornost is when the individual gives up self-benefit for the community or ecclesia.

We cannot truly be one in Christ if we do not seek out oneness with our fellow Christians. Nor can we be one with Christ if we routinely reject sobornost for heights of spirituality that make us so conscious of self that they separate us from our neighbor.






Orthodox Book Club Re-Boot!






